
Pasha Hawaii has come a long way from the summer of 1999 when the new shipping line first contemplated the construction of the Jean Anne. Choosing a proven roll-on/roll-off design that would provide the important competitive elements for participation in the Hawaii/Mainland trade lane, the company contracted with VT Halter Marine's shipyard in Pascagoula, MS for construction of the 579-foot vessel, with ten fully-enclosed decks. It took a few years from the keel laying in 2001 to vessel launch, but we persevered in our vision and mission.

We were aware of the importance of weekly frequency to a number of our clients and accordingly our business plan has always been to provide at least two vessels to the Hawaii market. Pasha Hawaii is therefore very pleased to announce that our second U.S. Flag vessel is set to enter the trade in the fall of 2013. The M/V Marjorie C will be constructed by VT Halter Marine, the same yard that delivered the M/V Jean Anne to Pasha Hawaii in March of 2005. Both vessels are based on designs by the Uljanik Shipyard in Croatia, which has collaborated with VT Halter Marine and Pasha Hawaii on the new ship's blueprint and design particulars.

The Marjorie C will present a different look to our shipping audience. She is bigger (692 feet), her stern ramp is rated up to 250 tonnes, and her design is a "ConRo" - a flexible combination of containers and roll-on/roll-off cargo. She will boast a capacity of 1,500 container TEUs and 2,750 automobiles. Her design will allow her to call ports on Maui and the big island of Hawaii directly - the only container vessel able to do so. Weekly service, and the addition of containers to our cargo mix, brings new opportunities for Pasha Hawaii to grow our customer base. It also brings added value to our current clients and to the people of Hawaii, who have extended such a warm welcome to us over the years. We are grateful for the support, and very pleased to announce that Honolulu will be the home port for the newest member of our fleet.

Jean Anne Celebrates

As we navigate through 2011, Pasha Hawaii's Jean Anne has a lot to celebrate. Singled out twice in 2010 by the Chamber of Shipping of America, she was presented in June with the Jones E. Devlin Safety Award, and in November was granted a Certificate of Environmental Achievement. In its 2005 annual American Ship Review issue, Professional Mariner Magazine honored the new 579-foot roll-on/roll-off vessel as its 'Ship of the Year.' As the first modern pure car/truck carrier built to meet the special requirements of the Jones Act, which sets standards for U.S.-flagged cargo-hauling ships, they called her "one of a kind." On March 8 of this year, Jean Anne accomplished 150 successful roundtrip transpacific crossings. Through six years of calm and stormy seas, she has logged almost 720,000 nautical miles. She cruised into her 7th year of service March 21, and now eagerly waits for the Marjorie C to join the fleet.

The Jean Anne has definitely exceeded our expectations. Our direct calls to the major ports of the Hawaiian Islands and the flexibility of our service have proved to be highly advantageous to our customers, whose support has never wavered. That support has been paramount to our success and encouraged us to grow our business

A new Terminal Operating Agreement with the Port of San Di-

ego means Pasha Automotive Services will be putting wheels on the ground at the National City Marine Terminal for another 30 years! The agreement, which extends through December 31, 2040, was unanimously approved by the San Diego Unified Board of Port commissioners on December 7, 2010.

The new agreement offers long-term stability to Pasha's clients and brings new cargo opportunities for the NCMT. Besides automobile imports and transportation services, Pasha can pursue general cargo, as approved by the Port District.

Pasha Automotive Services Vice President, John Pasha, comments, "There is no other West Coast solution like the NCMT which includes five berths, capacity for 180 railcars on site,

proximity to local and regional markets, a highly skilled and efficient workforce, and plenty of capacity to grow."

George Pasha, IV, Chief Executive Officer notes, "A 30-year agreement not only provides a long-term service solution for our OEM customers, but also for our company in supporting our investment in long-term assets such as the Jean Anne and our new vessel, the Marjorie C, both of which will serve the Hawaii market for at least 30 years."

2010 saw Pasha Automotive Services reach the four million mark in automobiles imported over the dock in San Diego, and celebrate their 20 years of operation at the NCMT. Now we're looking forward to attaining the half-century mark in partnership with the Port of San Diego.

PST Dry Bulk Expertise Helps Set Record Year at Grays Harbor

Pasha Stevedoring & Terminals is well known for its 20 years of handling U.S. West Coast steel imports in the Port of Los Angeles. But steel isn't the only ocean cargo that PST excels in handling. In partnership with the Port of Grays Harbor, in Aberdeen WA, PST has brought its expertise to AG Processing. AGP, a farmer-owned cooperative, is the largest soybean meal cooperative in the world. For the past seven years, Terminal 2 at Grays Harbor has been AGP's West Coast export hub for dry bulk products destined for Pacific Rim Markets, and PST has been the stevedore of choice with the 2009 award of the grain contract. The facility includes enclosed conveyors that transport product from the receiving building through a sampler and incline scales directly into the vessel. 2010 was a record year for PST, Grays Harbor and AGP with over one million metric tons put on board for export. On the heels of this record year at the Port of Grays Harbor ship loading facility, AGP is increasing the storage capacity by 33% by adding two more silos to its sixsilo expansion plan, for a total of eight silos. Look for more records to fall at Grays Harbor in 2011!

A new customer for PST at Grays Harbor is Trans-NET, Inc., a transportation and logistics consulting firm that handles commercial and project cargoes destined for the Russian Far East. Founded in 1994 by Peter Moe, Sr., Chairman of TNI, the company is an approved vendor for the Russian government. TNI notes that development of new and updated infrastructure for the remote and geographically challenging Russian Far East is an international priority, with access to the area's rich natural resources an important factor for Russia's economic growth. Safety First

PST continues to rack up Pacific Maritime Association safety awards, from the Pacific Northwest to Southern California. For the second consecutive year, the Group C Grays Harbor team took the first place Safety Award for Stevedoring, first place for Accident Prevention for a Two-Year Zero Injury Rate, and second place for PNW Coast Accident Prevention. PST has instituted a training program with the PMA and Local 24 for roll-on/roll-off vessels, which will assist in better utilization of space while loading out of Grays Harbor while maintaining its excellent safety record.

Meet the Marjorie C!

When she launches at the end of 2013, the M/V Marjorie C will ply the waters between Hawaii and California crossing paths with the Jean Anne, allowing Pasha Hawaii to offer weekly service. This additional service and capacity will allow us to handle the needs of this trade lane more efficiently, while delivering value to a broader range of customers. With a weekly shipping schedule, auto manufacturers will enjoy this augmented capability by handling peak shipping periods more effectively, as will shippers of heavy / over high and wide rolling stock and other cargoes. This carefully designed ConRo vessel will have the ability to carry approximately 1,500 TEUs above and under deck, as well as 2750 vehicles and over high and wide cargo. Along with ten cargo decks, a stern ramp rated at 250 tonnes and a

door entrance 39 feet wide by 21 feet high, she will offer a greater capability for our shippers of extreme over high and wide cargoes.

Reggie Maldonado, Pasha Hawaii General Manager adds, "Many of our customers encouraged us to diversify our capability. Our second vessel will both better serve this market and provide increased frequency and superior reliability."

CEO George Pasha comments, "We will keep a continued focus on maintaining our high performance standards, which have been outstanding over the last five years. Pasha Hawaii and the Marjorie C will introduce this same standard of service for our container business, while continuing to add value for our customers."
